FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT



Reflecting on the 2014-15 school year gives me an enormous amount of pride in what the students and staff members of Jenks Public Schools were able to achieve. We maintain high expectations for the performance of our students in each one of the “Five A’s” – academics, activities, arts, athletics, and attitude – and not only did our Jenks Trojans regularly meet those expectations, they continued to set a new standard of excellence in all of their endeavors. The 2015 senior class featured seven National Merit Finalists and five Academic All-Staters, and was offered over \$20 million in college scholarships.

As enrollment increased across the District, we continued to emphasize the use of new technology to enable our students to grow, innovate, and succeed. The 1:1 instructional initiative utilizing technology was expanded to give more students access to online resources.

Thanks to hard-working students and teachers, exceptional leadership, and an incredible number of parent volunteers, Jenks Southeast Elementary was one of five Oklahoma schools recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education. Southeast Elementary was designated as an “Exemplary High-Performing School” which is a distinction based on state test results and a variety of academic achievements.

On both sides of the river, parents, community leaders, and business owners continued to invest in our students and the progress of our District. Jenks patrons approved a bond issue of \$120 million to address several needs throughout the District. The bond dollars are being used for the construction of Northwest Elementary, which will open its doors in August of 2017, and many other capital improvements such as the renovation of Jenks High School, redesign of the Central Campus cafeteria, and the creation of additional classroom space.

As our District continues to grow, our unwavering commitment to students will not change. Providing new resources and well-rounded educational opportunities for each and every student is the number one priority for our teachers, staff, and administrators. BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Jenks Public Schools Board of Education is responsible for establishing policies and procedures for the operation of the school system. The Board must evaluate the needs of the District and the community while acting within the framework of Oklahoma and federal laws. Board members must live within District boundaries and are elected to five-year terms by patrons of the Jenks Public School District. Once elected, Board members must follow a strict code of ethics. In order to enact school policy, members of the Board are expected to study issues relating to public education and familiarize themselves with the students, staff members, and school sites within the District.

Board meetings are normally held on the first Monday of each month at 5 p.m. in the Education Service Center. Any citizen is welcome to attend Board meetings as an observer but in order to make public comments regarding agenda items, the citizen must register prior to the meeting. Members of the Board of Education or the Superintendent of Jenks Public Schools may invite members of the public to speak at board meetings for specific purposes. Organizations, groups, or individuals may request to speak to the Board by submitting requests in writing to the Clerk of the Board by 4 p.m. on the Wednesday prior to the meeting date.

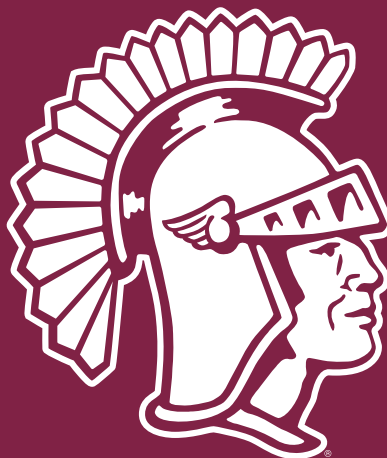

2014-15 JPS TEACHER OF THE YEAR JENNIFFER CALLAWAY

The most rewarding part of teaching at Jenks Alternative Center for Jenniffer Callaway is not a lesson or a test score, but a moment of realization from her students. “When students know they are accepted, barriers to learning can begin to fall and academic rigor can begin,” states Callaway.

For the past five years, Callaway has taught English and Healthy Lifestyles to high school students. One of 12 finalists for 2016 Oklahoma Teacher of the Year, Callaway believes her teaching style is driven by the relationships she forms with each one of her students. “Finding the treasure in each student drives me to walk into my classroom each day and extract the brilliance waiting to burst forth,” says Callaway. “Accept students for who they are, where they are in life, and then allow their gifts to develop in their own way.”

2015 BOND ISSUE

The state-of-the-art facilities at Jenks Public Schools are made possible due to the passage of bond issues by District patrons.

On February 10, 2015, voters approved a \$120 million bond issue for Jenks Public Schools, the second largest bond in District history. The bond dollars are being used for the construction of Northwest Elementary – the first new JPS elementary school in more than two decades – which is scheduled to open in August of 2017. In addition to Northwest Elementary, bond dollars were allocated for the following purposes:

- Central Campus Cafeteria Expansion and Kitchen Remodel
- District Agricultural Research Facility
- Elementary Classroom Space
- Intermediate Classroom Space
- Renovation of High School Buildings 5 and 6
- Textbooks/Media Equipment
- District-wide Technology Equipment and Improvements
- Facilities/Maintenance Improvements
- Parking Improvements at East Elementary
- Transportation Equipment
- District-wide Safety Improvements

The process of determining the needs of the District and the final dollar amount of the bond involves community members, parents, and JPS staff members who form the Bond Issue Task Force. A list of recommendations is presented to the Board of Education and it is the responsibility of the Board to review and finalize the items for the bond election ballot.

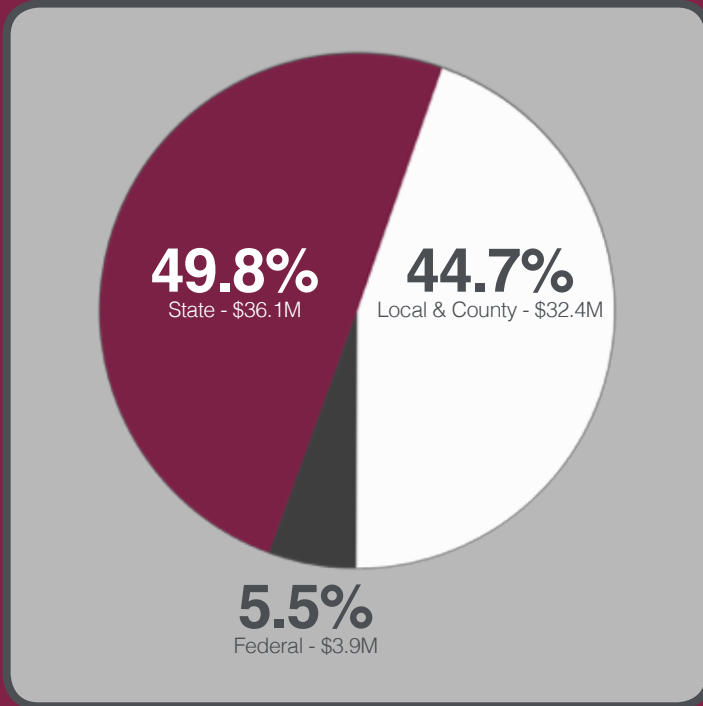


Rendering of Northwest Elementary School

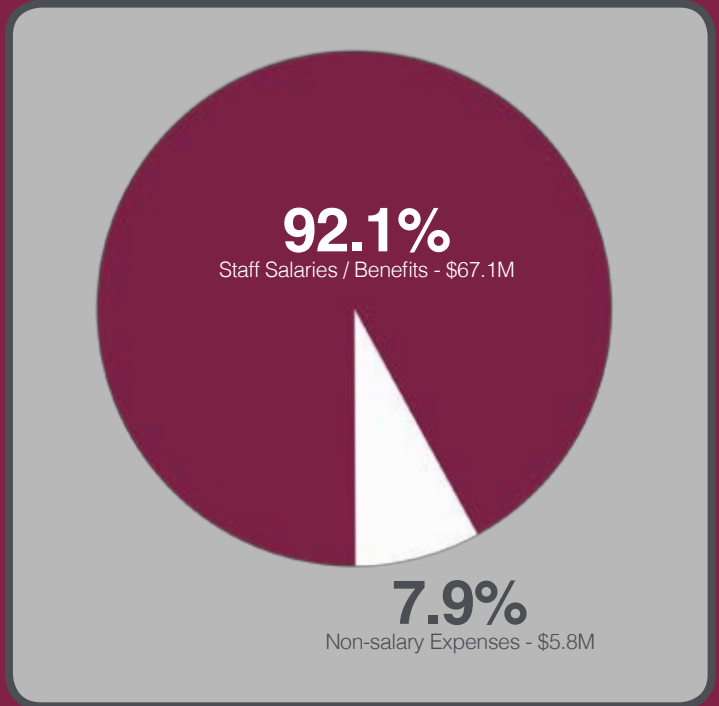
GENERAL FUND REVENUE SOURCES

General Fund revenue for 2014-15 was \$72,565,356. State sources, including the state aid formula, contributed 49 percent of the overall revenue. Local sources like property taxes accounted for 44 percent, and federal funds for recurring programs totaled 5.5 percent.



GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES

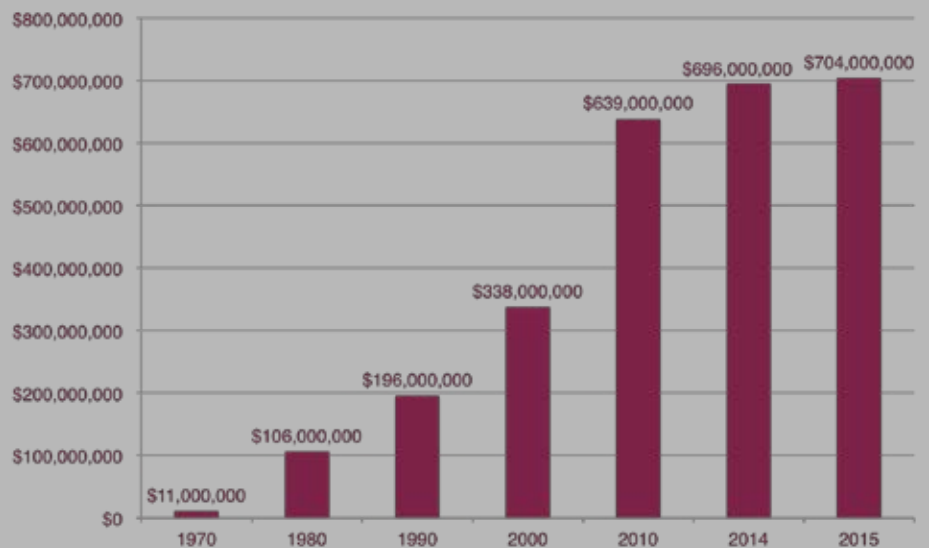
General Fund expenditures amounted to \$72,904,881 in 2014-15. Spending on salaries and benefits for teachers and staff comprised 92.1 percent of all expenditures while non-salary needs such as supplies, utilities, fuel, insurance, contract services, and property services totaled 7.9 percent of expenditures.



ENDING FUND BALANCE

Jenks Public Schools ended the 2014-15 year with a fund balance of \$6,803,333 which equals 9.3 percent of total revenues.

2015 TEST RESULTS

State standardized tests are used to assess students' proficiency in the Oklahoma Academic Standards. Jenks Public Schools' state assessment scores continue to be among the highest in the state thanks to the efforts of Jenks students and the tireless work of faculty and staff.

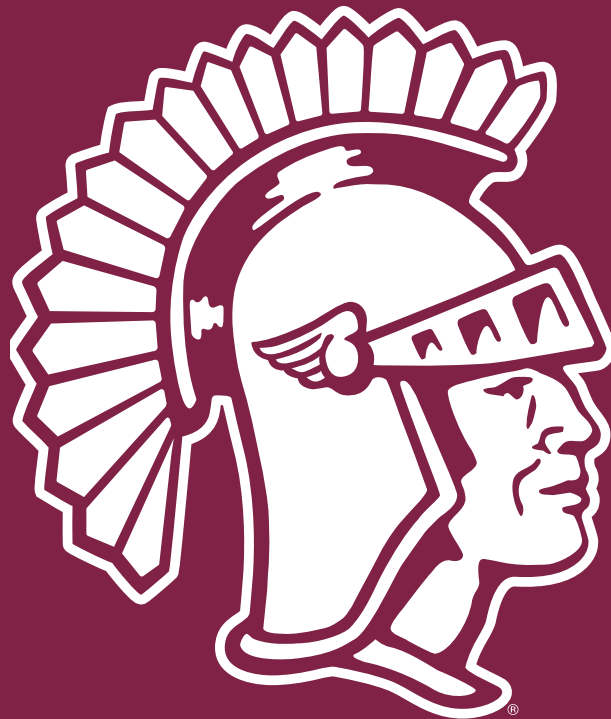
