Each year the Office of Educational Quality and Accountability issues a student performance report for Southeast Elementary. Our 2017 School Profile Report reflects results from last school year. As a reminder, the state of Oklahoma adopted much higher performance standards in 2017. Consequently, the test results are not comparable to those from previous years. However, Southeast Elementary third and fourth graders once again exceeded the state average in English Language Arts (ELA) and math. (Please note that ELA was referred to as reading prior to 2017.) The last page of the report reflects the progress of all Southeast Elementary third and fourth grade students, including our English Language Learners and our students receiving special education services. As part of our continuous improvement cycle, Southeast Elementary principals and teachers analyze this data and other assessments to identify and refine areas in of need improvement.

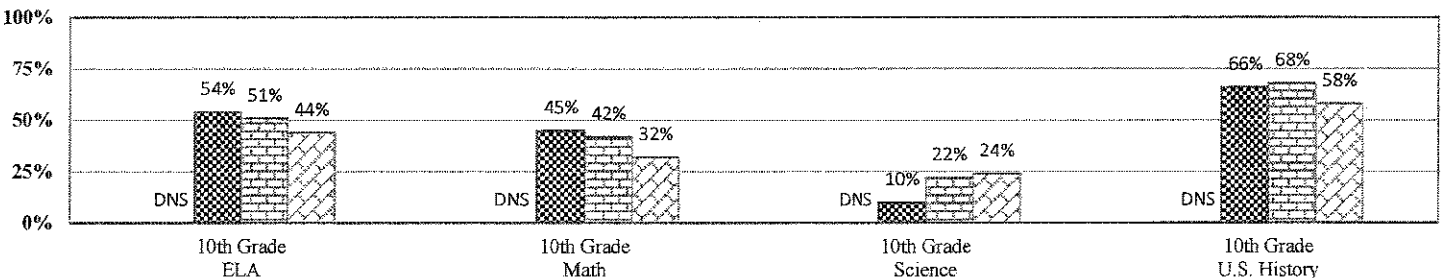

% of Students Scoring Proficient and Above by Grade and Subject

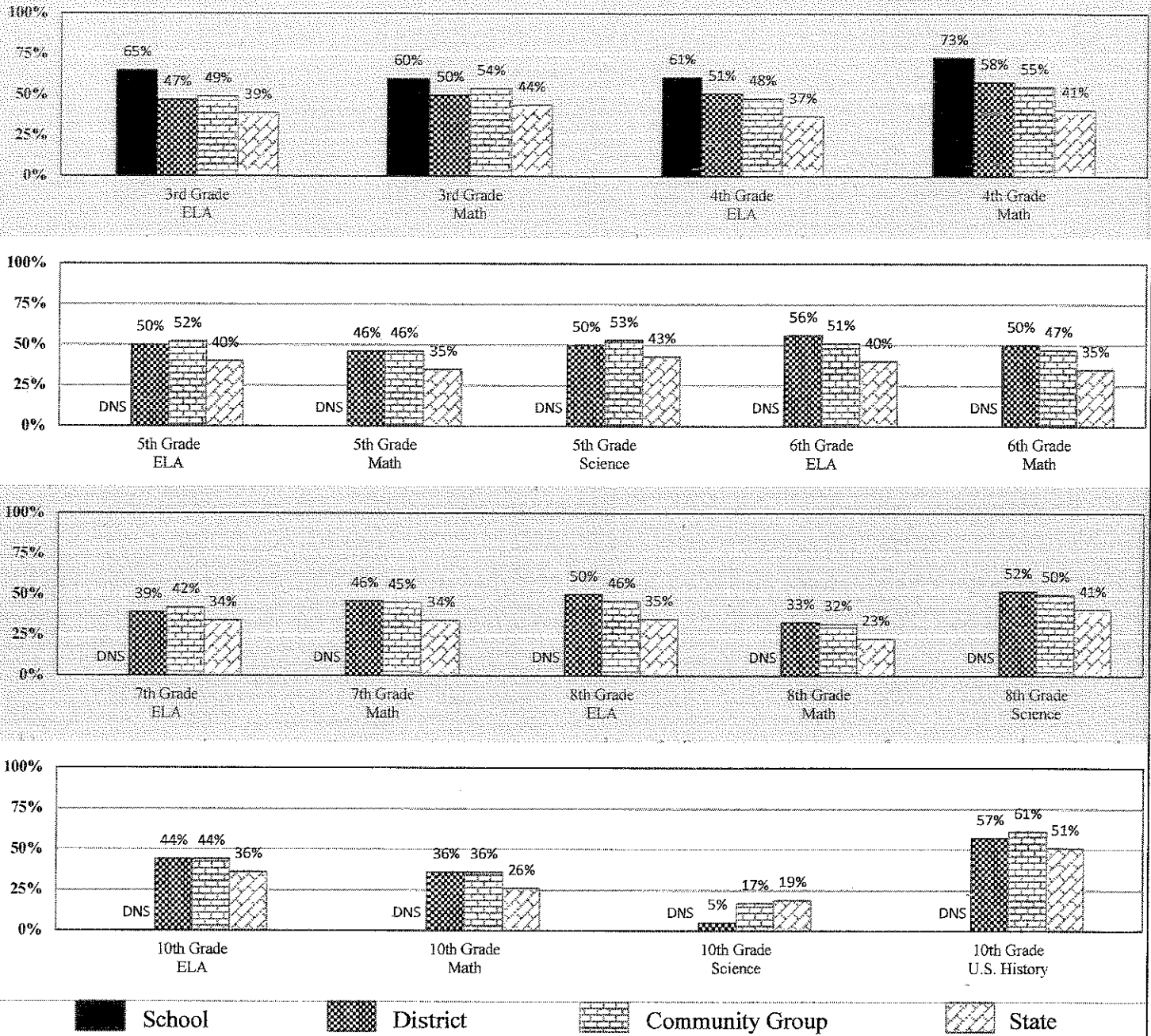
